Staff Present:

Approval of Agenda – Member Shanley made a motion to approve the agenda, second by Member Flowers. With Four (4) members voting aye, the motion was carried by a vote of 4 - 0.

Approval of Minutes – Member Shanley made a motion to approve the September 17, 2025, Committee Meeting minutes, second by Member Flowers. With four (4 ) members voting aye, the motion was carried by a vote of 4- 0.

Committee Reports and Updates

- A.** Animal Control Department Update – Animal Control Director Taylor Cosgrove directed the committee to page 5 of the packet, which covers the financials and bite reports, both of which have been relatively low for the month of October. Additionally, the average length of stay has been decreasing, attributed to increased adoptions and rescues taking in animals.
- B.** Emergency Management Agency Update – The Director of Emergency Management Roger Bonuchi directed the committee to the report update on page 15 of the packet. He also informed the committee about the new hire from the Lutheran Emergency Recovery Group, which focuses more on recovery efforts rather than emergency response.
- C.** Revolving Loan Status Update – The County Administrator Christina Burns directed the committee to page 17 of the packet for an update on the revolving loan fund. She noted that Lucky Beef and Camp Mutty Paws are in default, and staff have been making efforts to establish contact.
- D.** Kendall Area Transit Update – The report update can be found on page 18 of the packet. The County Administrator Christina Burns mentioned that staff have met with IDOT regarding the planning of the new facility. She also expressed appreciation to staff for their efforts in organizing the "Adopt the Rider" event.

- E. Economic Development Update – The Economic Development report is available on page 19 of the packet. Director Todd Volker informed the committee that the Made in Kendall program is currently underway. To date, there have been three nominations, with additional submissions expected in the coming weeks. Todd has also been working on the KEDA Summer Internship program. He has met with staff at Plano High School and Yorkville High School regarding student participation

New Committee Business – None

A. Discussion of Rabies Citations –

Animal Control Director Taylor Cosgrove provided the committee with an update on the status of Rabies Ordinance Enforcement. Staff are recommending an amendment to the Kendall County Code to authorize the Animal Control Director to issue citations for rabies non-compliance. Granting the Animal Control Director this authority will support compliance with the county’s rabies tag requirement and help increase departmental funds. After discussing various scenarios and clarifying the citation process, the committee agreed to move forward with the code amendment to implement this change, pending review by the State’s Attorney’s Office and to bring it back to the Committee of the Whole for further discussion.

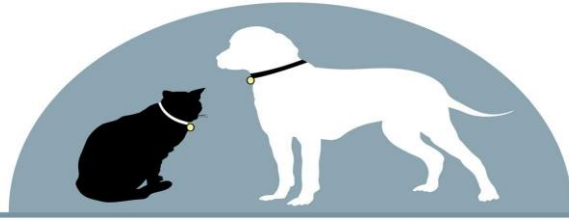

### Radiological Response (dosimetry, evacuation planning, public alert)

**Notification of Unusual Event (NOUE)** - A situation is in progress or already completed which could potentially degrade the plant's level of safety or indicate a security threat to the facility.

**Alert** – Events are in progress or have occurred which have (or could) substantially degrade the plant safety; or, a security event that could threaten site personnel or damage to site equipment is in progress.

**Site Area Emergency (SAE)** – Events are in progress or have occurred which have caused (or likely will cause) major failures of plant functions that protect the public, or involve security events with intentional damage or malicious acts that could lead to the likely failure of (or prevent effective access to) equipment needed to protect the public.

**General Emergency** – Events are in progress or have occurred which:

- a) have caused (or shortly will cause) substantial reactor core damage,
- b) with the potential for uncontrolled releases of radioactive material;

## **KENDALL COUNTY ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT**

### **YEAR IN REVIEW 2025**

2025 was an exceptionally active year for the Kendall County Economic Development Office, marked by expanded and strengthened programming, stronger partnerships, and impactful new initiatives.

Our full calendar of events and engagements built on 2024 activities and broadened our reach throughout the county and beyond. Highlights from the year included a commercial real estate summit, two factory tours, two job fairs, four chamber directors' meetings, and four meetings of municipal economic development professionals with the Kendall Economic Development Alliance (KEDA).

A special highlight was the successful launch of the Made in Kendall program recognizing outstanding manufacturers in Kendall County. Kendall County was also represented at monthly Greater Chicago Economic Partnership (GCEP) meetings, the UIRVDA annual meeting, the Chicago Commercial Real Estate Forecast, special GCEP events and at various area chamber of commerce gatherings.

From mid-April through June, Economic Development Coordinator Todd Volker sustained and recovered from a severe car crash, which slowed certain office activities. As a result, he was unable to attend the 2025 SelectChi and SelectUSA events — both of which are already scheduled for 2026 participation.

Kendall County renewed its membership in the Greater Chicago Economic Partnership for an additional year. The economic development department found GCEP membership to be valuable to Kendall County municipalities and to the county's work in economic development. GCEP research was used in business research and economic research.

#### **Business Engagement and Retention**

Our ongoing business retention efforts included regular visits with local employers and coordination of state-level requests for site selection information routed to appropriate municipalities. We participated with Intersect Illinois in a site visit to the Molto industrial site along I-80 north of Minooka. In 2025, business retention visits were made to Ravago, Boombah!, Anfinzen Assembly, and Fabtek Aero. Additional business support was provided to Breybourne Cricket Club and Tangent Technologies.

## **Internship Program Transformation**

We launched our summer internship program in 2025, learning valuable lessons from its initial rollout. Based on feedback, the program has been redesigned for 2026 and is now attracting strong interest from area employers and participation from high schools in the county.

## **Made in Kendall Initiative**

The Made in Kendall initiative debuted to considerable acclaim, quickly becoming a recognized platform for celebrating local manufacturers and makers. We kicked off October Manufacturing Month with a Manufacturers Breakfast and initiated meaningful conversations to strengthen relationships among local manufacturers.

## **Communication and Outreach Enhancements**

The economic development section of the Kendall County website received significant updates led by Management Analyst Natalia Borowska, and our office increased its use of social media to promote programs and events. Area chambers of commerce assisted with our outreach.

## **Job Fairs and Workforce Support**

Our spring and fall job fairs have become well-established, delivering tangible results for employers and jobseekers. In 2026, we plan to enhance these events with pre-fair workshops focused on resume preparation and interview skills.

## **Looking Ahead to 2026**

We are excited to build on our 2025 momentum:

- **National and Global Outreach:** We anticipate closer collaboration with GCEP to increase Kendall County's exposure to national and international opportunities. Our work with GCEP is an effective way to generate business attention to Kendall County.
- **Kendall Quality Program:** We intend to introduce a new county board designation to annually honor outstanding personal and business service providers in Kendall County, tentatively titled "Kendall Quality."
- **Strengthening KEDA:** In 2026, we will continue to work with local economic development staff on business visits.
- **Workforce Development Initiatives:** We plan to explore apprenticeship programs and a business acquisition workshop series with the local Small Business Development Center (SBDC). We will also produce spring and fall job fairs with new-to-2026 pre-fair workshops for job seekers, assisting with mock job interviews and resume writing coaching.
- **Manufacturing Promotion:** We will be exploring expanded programming to go with Manufacturing Month. We will also continue our popular twice-yearly factory tours that bring together manufacturing and business leaders, education leaders and local economic development professionals. We will again promote our successful "Made in Kendall" program and recognize important manufacturers and makers in the county.

- **Marketing Planning:** We will be developing further marketing resources for Kendall County in 2026 as we prepare an effective marketing plan proposal for the county.

The event included Ms. Burns speaking on a panel of GCEP leaders about what the larger Chicago region has to offer, and networking with businesses seeking expansion and relocation opportunities.

“KENDALL QUALITY” Program Standards  
Kendall County Economic Development Office

The “Kendall Quality” recognition is a program of the Kendall County Economic Development Office with the goal of promoting excellence in professional and business services. The recognition shines a light on valuable services of exceptional quality offered in Kendall County.

The “Kendall Quality” program conveys an honorific distinction to a firm in Kendall County. “Kendall Quality” is not an award. It is instead a designation given annually to top firms in the county with recipients entitled to display the “Kendall Quality” logo and refer to the distinction in marketing materials, publicity and promotion. There are no “winners” and the designation is not a prize. Recipients receive public notice at a special session of the Kendall County Board and receive a “Kendall Quality” plaque and a county board recognition resolution citing their distinction.

PROCEDURES AND CRITERIA

1. The recognition process begins each February with nominations accepted through the end of May for the “Kendall Quality” recognition. Announcement of the recognition will be made at a June county board meeting with a board reception for recognition winners.
2. Nominations are accepted in two main divisions: business services and professional services. The program does not include personal services such as retail stores, barbershops, beauty salons, nail salons, yoga studios, gyms, car detailing and auto repair. The “Kendall Quality” designation need not be declared in every division or category each year. The designation system does not include an “honorable mention” or “second place” distinction.

Business services are defined as requiring technical education and certification, and offering general business services, e.g., accounting, title processing, banking.

Professional services are defined as requiring specific professional education and certification and offering individualized technical services, e.g., medical, legal services.

3. The “Kendall Quality” recognition will be decided by a panel consisting of Kendall County staff, a county board member and representatives of the business community. The panel will judge nominations based on business reputation, business communications with clients, cost effectiveness and effectiveness of the service provider.
4. The recipients of the “Kendall Quality” recognition will receive a plaque recognizing the company and its employees, recognition on the Kendall County “Kendall Quality” Honor Roll and will receive press and social media attention.

5. Eligibility. Service businesses must be in Kendall County. The businesses' headquarters need not be in the county but they must have a physical location within the county and not merely operate within the county.

Businesses must have been in operation for a minimum of six months to qualify for the distinction.

Firms nominated are subject to verification by the "Kendall Quality" panel or by the Kendall County Economic Development Office.

6. Nominations. Nominations must include the name of the business, a short description of the business' services and why its service or services are outstanding. It may include a description of the community impact the business has. The nomination must include business contact information, and the email and telephone numbers of the person making the nomination.
