### **12-year Prison Sentence after jury trial for Child Sex Offender**

Kendall County State's Attorney Eric Weis announced today that Chaske Roskopf of Yorkville, Illinois was sentenced to a total of 12 years in the Illinois Department of Corrections by Judge Jody Gleason after a contested sentencing hearing this week. Roskopf had previously been found guilty of two counts of Aggravated Criminal Sexual Assault after a jury trial back in October of 2025. Aggravated Criminal Sexual Assault is a Class X felony punishable by 6-30 years in prison for each count.

Charges were filed back in 2022 when an investigation by the Kendall County Sheriff's Office revealed that Roskopf had been sexually assaulting a minor female child starting when she was just 9 years old by using force. The sexual assaults continued until the minor child was approaching 13. Roskopf admitted to some of the sexual assaults but only to some acts and only when he himself was a minor. He further admitted that they occurred in his home. The jury convicted Roskopf of the two counts of Aggravated Criminal Sexual Assault after listening to the evidence over a three-day period.

During the sentencing hearing, the Court heard two very powerful victim impact statements, one from the victim and one from the victim's mother, as well as considered the evidence presented at trial about Roskopf attempting to pay the victim for continued sexual activities. Judge Gleason sentenced Roskopf to the minimum sentence of 6 years in prison on each count for a total of 12 years in prison. The sentence will require Roskopf to serve 85% of his 12-year total sentence before being eligible for Mandatory Supervised Release. Additionally, he will have to register as a child sex offender for the rest of his life.

Weis thanked the Kendall County Sheriff's Office and the Kendall County Child Advocacy Center for their collaborative efforts. Weis praised the victim in this case for having the courage to come forward and testify about these horrific events.

The case was prosecuted by State's Attorney Eric Weis and Assistant State's Attorney Jennifer Cusack. Roskopf was represented by Attorney Steven Weinberg and Attorney Alexandria Miceli.
